#### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On this Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, may we all find ourselves within the Passion story. Jesus' mission is to save all humanity and that also means us. How is he saving you and me? Do we grasp and understand the words that we hear prayed after the "Our Father": "...as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ"? What are you and I hoping for? What is it that you and I are dealing with this very day – what struggles, temptations, situations, problems, etc. – in other words, what cross are we bearing now? We all have a cross, as Jesus reminds us: "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:27). "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Mark 8:34).

The cross each of us carries is for our salvation and will also lead others to salvation, to Jesus Christ. We have been brought into union with Jesus and His mission through our baptism. Jesus is with us and those words, "the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ", are true – Jesus is always coming to us who cry out to Him! Yes, "we await the blessed hope" and persevere carrying that daily cross because it leads us to something much greater. Let us pray this week the wonderful Psalm 27 that concludes in these words: "Wait for the Lord, take courage; be stouthearted, wait for the Lord!"

The Paschal Triduum begins the evening of Holy Thursday. May these holy days be lived well in our homes and among family. Let us respect silence and avoid all unnecessary tasks and contemplate the Lord Jesus through pray, fasting, and reflection. While attending the Liturgy on these three days, remember to respect the silence upon leaving the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. You may spend time in Joseph Hall to adore the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament until 11:00 PM Thursday evening. We respect the silence upon entering the church for the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday. During the Adoration of the Holy Cross, do not take this gesture in a sentimental way but bring your cross and unite it to Jesus' saving cross, asking for the grace to persevere in carrying your daily cross. Thank the Lord for your cross because it is, for each of us, our way to salvation. Upon conclusion of both the Holy Thursday and Good Friday liturgies, there is no formal dismissal with the sign of the cross. We silently depart both liturgies and I encourage us to help each other by respecting this silence. God wants to speak to us through this silence! Let us listen in the silence for the Lord desires to speak to each of us in our hearts. Holy Saturday is a somber day of preparation for the Paschal Vigil. May we continue to avoid unnecessary works and live that day in prayer and fasting as well. Jesus is coming and may we prepare our hearts to celebrate the Victory that concludes the Triduum.


