THE PARABLE OF THE TALENTS MATTHEW 25:14-30 Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On November 13, a baby girl named Indi passed to the heavenly Father. She died because the British legal system prevented her from traveling to Rome to be treated at the Vatican pediatric hospital, Bambino Gesù (Baby Jesus). The parents are not Christian, but the father, Dean Gregory, stated, "I am not religious, and I am not baptized, but when I was in court, I felt like I had been dragged to hell. I thought that if hell exists, then heaven must also exist... It was as if the devil was there. I thought that if the devil exists, then God must exist... I've seen what hell is like and I want Indi to go to heaven." Mr. Gregory had been impressed by the Christian "witness" as he and his wife went through this ordeal. This is the style of evangelization that the last few Popes have been emphasizing that will bring others to Christ. A Christian volunteer at the hospital told Mr. Gregory that "baptism protects you and opens the door to heaven for you." Mr. Gregory is now seeking to be baptized.

This is a sad story but also an important one. There is truth in those words about baptism for his little baby, but now for Mr. Gregory, what will that mean for him?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 1213 sums it up: Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit (*vitae spiritualis ianua*), and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water and in the word."

United to Jesus Christ and as a member of the Church, all the baptized are "made sharers in her mission". Every baptized person shares in the mission to save souls! We are truly taking on the role of Jesus Christ himself: to save souls!

I would encourage everyone to reflect on The Catechism of the Catholic Church, Section Two, Article 1, The Sacrament of Baptism (numbers 1213 -1284). Baptism is often misunderstood and sometimes perceived as individualistic, a personal saving grace only, and missing the communal aspect, uniting us to Jesus and one another, thus becoming witnesses, like the Christian who helped the Gregory family. CCC 1270: "Reborn as sons of God, [the baptized] must profess before men the faith they have received from God through the Church" and participate in the apostolic and missionary activity of the People of God.

May you and your families have a Blessed Thanksgiving!!!


Apostle Paul In the Modern Day

about how they can be an effective sign of Christ's presence to each other, to their future children and to those around them.


