

"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"This is the time of fulfillment." Jesus' words that begin his public ministry. "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law, so that we might receive adoption" (Galatians 4:4-5). "In him we have redemption in his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavishes upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth" (Ephesians 1:7-10).

"Anno Domini" means "In the Year of the Lord", thus A.D. would be written after the current year. We are in the year of our Lord 2024. The secular world, removing any recognition of Christianity calls it C.E., the Common Era. "B.C. E." simply means "before the common era". Yet, it is based on the coming of the fullness of time in Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world. Whether one uses A.D. or B.C.E., the truth is that the current calendar is based on the birth of Jesus.

What a wonderful passage from St. Paul: "to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth." He comes to save the world, everyone on the planet!

Today's first reading shows the humility of the gentiles (pagans) in Nineveh. "Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, 'Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed,' when the people of Nineveh **believed God**; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth." This moved God to be merciful and compassionate for those people because "they turned from their evil way".

Jesus tells the people in Galilee: "The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." The "gospel" is "good news", as shown by God in the first reading. God is love, mercy, compassion.

"For the world in its present form is passing away" (1 Corinthians 7:31). "Do not love the world or the things of the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, sensual lust, enticement for the eyes, and a pretentious life, is not from the Father but from the world. Yet the world and its enticement are passing away. But whoever does the will of God remains forever" (1 John 2:15-17).

Let us be grateful for the gift of our faith and for the salvation Jesus brings. Let us be his instruments of love, mercy, and compassion in this generation.

Free Coach Bus Ride to State Capital on January 22

Please join the rally to save the unborn. In 2023, Minnesota lawmakers passed legislation legalizing abortion-up-to-birth. They also repealed a newborn's right to lifesaving treatment. Even more anti-life measures are being considered for 2024. Now is the time to make clear to our elected officials that no child is forgotten, and that moms and babies deserve our protection.

As in the past, Owatonna Bus Company will provide a free coach bus to St. Paul. The bus will board at the Sacred Heart Church parking lot in Owatonna at 8:00 am on January 22 (leaving at 8:15). The bus will stop at the Speedway Travel Plaza in Faribault at 8:40.

At 10:00, we will be dropped off at the Cathedral of St. Paul for a prayer service. Then, we will walk to the capital for the March for Life which begins at noon.
