

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I write this, it is the Passion of Saint John the Baptist. Today's Gospel from Mark begins: "Herod was the one who had John the Baptist arrested and bound in prison on account of Herodias, the wife of his brother Philip, whom he had married. John had said to Herod, 'It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.'" This is the sin of adultery, and John was calling Herod to conversion. The Gospel continues: "Herodias harbored a grudge against him and wanted to kill him but was unable to do so." Interesting, how Herodias' attitude is that of King David's when he committed adultery. He had Uriah killed in battle purposely. Returning to the Gospel: "Herod feared John, knowing him to be a righteous and holy man, and kept him in custody. When he heard him speak, he was very much perplexed, yet he liked to listen to him." Herod's heart was still open to the truth while Herodias' heart seethed with anger. Herod would fall through affections, worried to please the people rather than God. That was his downfall.

We can learn much about ourselves from this story. St. Augustine, whom we celebrated this past week as well, sums up the truth: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." Our hearts are moved by the truth. Lust, often confused for love, deceives and blinds. John the Baptist nearly won back the soul of Herod. Affections are dangerous because they rest more on feelings than truth. We want to be liked, admired, respected by others, sometimes at all costs. Such is the case of Herod. He loses because he has failed to keep God first. He tried but his own strength failed him. Only God can save us. And he can save us if we repent, even after we have failed, after we have fallen, after we have sinned.

Take the case of Jeremiah in today's reading. The prophet says that "the word of the Lord has brought me derision and reproach all the day." He becomes "an object of laughter; everyone mocks me." "I say to myself, I will not mention him, I will speak in his name no more." Well, so much for following the Lord! We know in our hearts the truth, like Herod, but we are tempted to follow the ways of the status quo, to fit in like all the rest. We want to be liked by everyone, just like Herod. Our affections trap us.

Jeremiah is human and wishes his role was not so contentious. We all have had the experience of Jeremiah while on this journey of following the Lord. It's the cross Jesus announces in the Gospel. And that cross reveals the way, the truth, and the life, as Jeremiah again experiences: "But then it becomes like fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones; I grow weary holding it in, I cannot endure it." We can then say like Jeremiah, "You duped me, O Lord, and I let myself be duped; you were too strong for me, and you triumphed." The triumph of the cross! The way to salvation is through the cross!

Paul encourages us in the second reading: "Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, **what is good and pleasing and perfect**." It pleases God that we desire the grace to do his will and become his instruments to share the good, the true, and the beautiful.

Pope Francis said it well at Mass on February 8, 2019, commenting on the martyrdom of John the Baptist (Mk 6:14-29): "Life has value only in giving it, in giving it in love, **in truth**, in giving it to others, in daily life, in the family." Jesus gave his life so that we may have life and life in abundance! Like Jeremiah, that life given within us is "a fire burning in [our] heart[s]". It moves us to share the truth in love and to desire the salvation of others, to be the living "sacrament of salvation" for the world.
