The Lord sits as King for ever. Psalm 29:10 Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This is the last week in Ordinary Time and next Sunday we begin Advent. Today is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. We share in the kingship of Christ through baptism. How many times we have seen Jesus reigning in our world, especially over sin, the most important aspect of this sovereignty? Jesus' power is unlike that of the kings of the earth. He rules with love and mercy. Since He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, His kingdom comes among us through Word and Sacrament, where He reigns within our hearts and souls.

Today's Gospel reminds me of Jesus' reign within the lives of Christians. Servant of God Dorothy Day encountered Jesus' mercy through the forgiveness of her sins and her life took a new direction, in helping the poor. Servant of God Jérôme Lejeune cared for his Down Syndrome patients with immense love. St. Teresa of Calcutta served the poorest of the poor. Venerable Aloysius Schwartz left the United States and served the poor in Korea and the Philippines.

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me." Brothers in Christ, brothers in the human family, brothers all. This is how Pope Francis wants us to see those around us. It is also our Christian call to serve others with love. As Catholics, we have the seven corporal works of mercy and the seven spiritual works of mercy that help us encounter Christ in the poor. It is not so much as us earning points or badges of honor for the good we do but knowing that the grace of God moves us into loving action. We *do* for the glory of God and not for ourselves. That is why it is also humble service, like Jesus, who gave all the glory to his Father.

"...through Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom you bestow on the world all that is good." The conclusions of both the third and fourth Eucharistic Prayers reminds us that it is God who grants us the grace to do good. That is what the meaning of Jesus reigning in our hearts is all about. That is how we live fully human lives, united with God and one another through love. This love reigns in our hearts and can only bring forth more love.


The battle for our souls is at stake. United to Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we understand St. Pauls' words: "What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? As it is written: 'For your sake we are being slain all the day; we are looked upon as sheep to be slaughtered.' No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor

principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:35-39).

May the Peace and Love of Our Lord Jesus Christ reign in your hearts now and forever!!!
