Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I ask your good prayers for all of us priests of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester as we begin Presbyteral Days this week, beginning this Sunday evening. It was wonderful to see the seminarians at the diaconal ordination in Waseca two weeks ago. Archbishop Timothy Broglio of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA was present along with several other military chaplains, one being an old classmate from my seminary days in New Jersey. This military chaplain preached the homily at the Servant of God Fr. Emil Kapaun's much delayed funeral back in 2021.

Who is Fr. Emil Kapaun? For those of Czech/Bohemian ancestry, Fr. Kapaun was the son of immigrant Czech parents who settled on a farm in Pilsen, Kansas. He served as a military chaplain in Burma and India during World War II and returned to serve in his local Diocese of Wichita, including his home parish. He asked to return to the military and was granted release to minister to the soldiers in the Pacific. War broke out between North and South Korea, where Fr. Kapaun would spend the last days of his life. He was captured by the Chinese and detained in a prisoner of war camp. He uplifted the spirits of the freezing and starving prisoners, giving them a will to live amidst great hardships. Fr. Kapaun would die from mistreatment and poor health, buried in a shallow grave dug by the hands of his fellow soldiers – without the aid of shovels or digging implements. It was May 23, 1951. When news reached his home Diocese of Wichita several weeks later, a Memorial Mass was offered for his soul at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Wichita.

Word began to spread immediately about the heroic deeds of this young priest. A short film was made about his military service and imprisonment. Time passed and he was forgotten but not by the good people of Pilsen and the Diocese of Wichita. Three cases of possible miracles have been attributed to Fr. Kapaun's intercession. His remains were thought to have been in some unmarked grave in North Korea.

In 2003, ten years after the Church had granted the title Servant of God upon this chaplain, more came to light about his burial and the possibility that he was moved to an unmarked grave on the Hawaiian island of Oahu and the Punchbowl Cemetery (National Memorial of the Pacific Cemetery in Honolulu). This happened in 1954, when over 800 unknown soldiers were unearthed from Noth Korean graves and brought for burial on U.S soil. A moving ceremony at the White House on April 11, 2013 conferred the Medal of Honor posthumously upon

Fr. Kapaun for his heroic service, with some of his fellow prisoners present. In 2021, his remains were identified through forensic studies and DNA testing. Fr. Kapaun's skeletal remains, almost completely intact at 95%, were ceremoniously honored from Hawaii to Pilsen to Wichita, worthy of a military hero. His funeral Mass was celebrated and broadcast live on EWTN on September 29, 2021. He rests in a tomb open to the faithful to pray and ask the Servant of God's intercession in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Wichita.

This coming Veterans Day (November 11) we will remember our veterans and pay tribute to them with a special presentation on the life of the Servant of God Fr. Kapaun. Stay tuned to this bulletin for more details on this upcoming event.

Diocesan Year of Eucharistic Revival Reception of Holy Communion

In this time of Eucharistic Revival, we are seeing that Holy Communion is the incomparable fruit of the Eucharistic Sacrifice, namely, the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

Lest we profane the Body and Blood of Our Lord, proper disposition for the reception of Holy Communion requires that the communicant:

- Be in full communion with the Catholic Church, participating regularly in Sunday Mass, and living in accord with her teachings.
- Be in a state of grace, that is, not conscious of having committed grave sin which has not been forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance.
- Have fasted from food and drink, (except for water and medicine), for at least one hour.
- Our bodily demeanor, including our manner of dress and our gestures, should reflect fully our faith in the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament.
- If receiving on the hand, make a throne of left hand under right hand, receiving on the left hand, then using right hand to partake of the Blessed Sacrament. If left-handed, do the opposite.

Any question regarding the proper disposition to receive Holy Communion should be addressed with a priest before coming forward to receive Our Lord in the Most Holy Sacrament.

Even if you are not able to receive Holy Communion now, you are invited to pray a Spiritual Communion: "My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Eucharist. Since I cannot receive you sacramentally at this time, come spiritually into my soul. I embrace You as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you."


