Monsignor Cook's Corner

5th Sunday of Easter

Monday, April 29, is the **Memorial of St. Catherine of Siena**, one of three women Doctors of the Church (along with St. Teresa of Avila and St. Thérèse of Lisieux). At the age of sixteen, St. Catherine joined the third order Dominicans, known as the *Mantellate*, and donned the white and black Dominican habit. In 1376 she famously exhorted Pope Gregory XI to return to Rome from Avignon, France, where the popes had been living since 1309. St. Catherine of Siena received the stigmata (the wounds of Christ in her body), but they did not show externally until she died in Rome on 29 April 1380, at the age of 33, near the Dominican church of Santa Maria Sopra Minerva, where her body is buried under the high altar. Her mystical writings are profoundly beautiful. In the Office of Readings for her feast day we read: *"Eternal Trinity, you are a Mystery deep as the sea. The more I search, the more I find, and the more I find, the more I search for you. But I can never be satisfied; what I receive will ever leave me desiring more. When you fill my soul, I have an even greater hunger, and I grow more famished for your light. I desire above all to see you, the true Light as you really are."*

Wednesday, May 1, is the **Feast of St. Joseph the Worker**. The Feast of St. Joseph the Worker, instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1955, is "Catholic Labor Day" – a day to honor the dignity of human labor as a participation in the Lord's own creative work in the world. Pope Saint John Paul II reminds us, however, that there is a danger that "the prodigious power over creation which God gives to man can lead him to forget that God is the Creator upon whom everything depends." As important as work is, rest is also sacred "because it is man's way of withdrawing from the sometimes excessively demanding cycle of earthly tasks in order to renew his awareness that everything is the work of God." Hence, "Christians are obliged to arrange their Sunday rest in a way which allows them to take part in the Eucharist, and to refrain from those works or activities which hinder the worship owed to God, or which hinder the necessary rest of mind and body." (*Dies Domini*, #65 & 67 and CCC #2185)

In addition to the 7:15 a.m. Mass on Wednesday, there will be two special Masses for the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Father Parrott will offer the St. Mary's School Mass on Wednesday, May 1, at 8:10 a.m. <u>at St. Joseph Church</u>. Everyone is invited to join the students and teachers, who will be walking over to St. Joseph Church from the school.

On Wednesday, May 1, at 6:30 p.m., I will offer Mass at St. Joseph Parish to conclude our Faith Formation year. <u>All students, parents, and catechists who participate in our Wednesday evening Religious Education Program</u> <u>are required to attend this Mass</u>. It is fitting that this last class of the year should be in Our Lord's "classroom" where we are all His students, eager to learn from the Master Teacher.

As this year's formal Religious Education Classes come to an end, I want to say **thank you** to all of our **catechists** for helping teach the Catholic Faith every Wednesday evening. In a special way I would like to thank **Brittany Boubin**, our Faith Formation Coordinator, for her dedication to forming our young people with the mind and heart of Christ.




