The parable of the ten virgins. Matthew 25:1-13

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This week five of the six saints who have memorials or optional memorials are women. Three were members of religious orders, and two of them served here in the United States. The other two were married and raised children.


Monday is St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, who was called to the Lord on 22 December 1917 in Chicago. She was the youngest of thirteen children, small in stature and considered sickly, having been turned down by a religious order. However, a priest encouraged her to serve at an orphanage and some years later the bishop of her diocese helped her found the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. She had her sights set on China but in a meeting with Pope Leo XIII, he told her to go west, and she obeyed. She landed in New York with six sisters accompanying her and it was a difficult mission from the start. The Archbishop of New York did not even welcome her but told her that she should return to Italy. She saw the suffering of the immigrants and the sisters began their work.

One of the foundations that has great importance for me was an orphanage she founded in Kearny, New Jersey. The Ku Klux Klan (KKK) burnt a cross on the lawn of the orphanage not too long after it was established. It did not deter the sisters from their work. As the years passed, orphanages began to close thanks to foster homes. The property in Kearny continued as a Montessori school, staffed by the Sacred Heart Sisters. The chapel became a shrine of the Holy Face of Jesus and eventually the school and property were up for sale. Interested parties included other churches, one that was anti-Catholic. In 1990, through the intercession of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, the building and grounds became home to Redemptoris Mater Archdiocesan Missionary Seminary of the Archdiocese of Newark. Mother Cabrini's missionary spirit never left the property!

The story about the seminary is impressive. Two priests departed Rome with twelve seminarians to establish a "diocesan-missionary" seminary in the United States, hoping to do so in New York. It seemed to follow the same trajectory of Mother Cabrini as they, too, did not have luck in New York. Crossing the Hudson River, they inquired in the Archdiocese of Newark, and it seemed they were getting the same answer until someone mentioned a property available near the Passaic River in Kearny. The future formators had

petitioned the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph for help in establishing this new seminary. They also thought that a saint from the United States should be invoked as well. They soon learned that Mother Cabrini received citizenship in the United States, so it made sense to ask this Italian nun for her help. Upon learning that this was her foundation, well, enough said!

I am grateful for this patroness of immigrants and migrants, who certainly has interceded for all the men who have been ordained priests from that house of formation. I would not be here if not for her. As the late, great Paul Harvey would say, "And now you know the rest of the story."
