

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On behalf of myself and Fr. Parrott, we want to thank you for your prayers, good wishes, cards, and gifts last Sunday as we celebrated Priesthood Sunday. It was a good segue into Presbyteral Days in Okoboji, as we priests gathered with Bishop Barron for prayer, reflection, and fraternity. Please continue your good prayers for us as well as for vocations. God willing, we will have three ordinations to the priesthood next year and then another three the following year!

October is Pro Life Month. The sanctity of the person was reiterated by Pope Francis as he returned from Marseille, France, his latest trip outside the Vatican. He spoke to journalists on the return flight, stating: "You don't play with life, neither at the beginning nor at the end. It is not played with!" We emphasize the importance of the "right to life" at all stages of life. The Holy Father continued: "Whether it is the law not to let the child grow in the mother's womb or the law of euthanasia in disease and old age, I am not saying it is a faith thing, but it is a human thing: There is bad compassion." The point Pope Francis makes is clear: "It is a human thing", because our faith upholds the natural law, respecting the dignity of every person at all stages of life. Our state of Minnesota continues to see moves in the legislature that want to condone euthanasia and abortion and surgery upon minors for sex change operations. The sad ideology behind the justification of these proposed laws is the individual's rights. With all due respect to every individual and our rights as citizens, abortion takes away the right of a person in the womb. If we deny the right of that child, we deny the right of every person! It is hypocritical and illogical.

When we read Genesis (chapters 1 through 3) and the story of the Adam and Eve's fall from grace, we are given a clear understanding of what it means to listen to the serpent (the devil) and thus become "like gods who know what is good and what is bad" (3:5). Before this temptation and fall from grace, the man and woman knew only the good, being in the presence of God in the garden. They knew neither fear nor evil, only goodness, and beauty, and truth. They experienced a deep love from God. Upon sinning through disobedience, they experienced fear for the first time as well as shame.

Adam will show his selfishness in his response to God. Instead of defending the woman, whom he told God upon seeing her for the first time: "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called 'woman,' for out of 'her man' this one has been taken" (2:23), he says, "The woman whom you put here with me—she gave me fruit from the tree, and so I ate it" (3:12). A careful reading will say he is telling the truth but perhaps he emphasized blame in two ways: pointing the finger at Eve, as if to say, "It's all her fault" and then also God, "You put her here with me!"

The spirit of relativism arises when we all become "like gods" and decide on our own truths. God created order out of the chaos that existed. Our sin has brought chaos back into the world and we can see this in the division it fosters. God is about love and unity. The evil one is about hatred and division.

The remedy? Jesus Christ, the New Adam!

The old Adam could have said, "It was my fault. I left Eve alone when the serpent tempted her. Treat me as the one at fault and not her." As they both ate the forbidden fruit, it removed even compassion from their hearts. The Passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus restores what was lost through the Fall. We are returned to the state of life with God and can love in a new dimension, love in the dimension of the cross. The serpent spoke from a tree and deceived humanity. Jesus spoke from the tree of the cross and saved humanity! He took the blame for us: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34).

May we pray for those who are deceived about the gift of life, that God's grace can restore them as it has restored us. We are indeed all made in the image and likeness of God!

Diocesan Year of Eucharistic Revival Reception of Holy Communion

In this time of Eucharistic Revival, we are seeing that Holy Communion is the incomparable fruit of the Eucharistic Sacrifice, namely, the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

Lest we profane the Body and Blood of Our Lord, proper disposition for the reception of Holy Communion requires that the communicant:

- Be in full communion with the Catholic Church, participating regularly in Sunday Mass, and living in accord with her teachings.
- Be in a state of grace, that is, not conscious of having committed grave sin which has not been forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance.
- Have fasted from food and drink, (except for water and medicine), for at least one hour.
- Our bodily demeanor, including our manner of dress and our gestures, should reflect fully our faith in the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament.
- If receiving on the hand, make a throne of left hand under right hand, receiving on the left hand, then using right hand to partake of the Blessed Sacrament. If left-handed, do the opposite.

Any question regarding the proper disposition to receive Holy Communion should be addressed with a priest before coming forward to receive Our Lord in the Most Holy Sacrament.

Even if you are not able to receive Holy Communion now, you are invited to pray a Spiritual Communion: "My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Eucharist. Since I cannot receive you sacramentally at this time, come spiritually into my soul. I embrace You as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you."


