FOR WHERE TWO OR THREE ARE GATHERED TOGETHER IN MY NAME There I am in the midst of them. Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Two Sundays ago, we heard Jesus tell Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Today we hear about fraternal correction, concluding thus: "If he refuses to listen even to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector. Amen, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

The first reading from the prophet Ezekiel reveals a responsibility we have toward our neighbor, especially his salvation. We are speaking clearly here of the community, those united as a community of faith in the one true God of Judaism. Every community was responsible in helping all the brothers and sisters to follow the ways of God and to live up to the call made on their lives. Their example would speak volumes to the surrounding peoples, who lived by another standard or no standard at all. Witness would enlighten others to the truth of why and how the Hebrews lived, following the one true God. Christianity continues in this tradition of witness. St. Paul sums it up very simply in today's second reading: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the law."

Great words because this is God's truth. How do we put this into practice?

In the opening prayer we are asking God to "look graciously upon your beloved sons and daughters, that those who believe in Christ may receive true freedom and an everlasting inheritance." This is our answer to fulfilling God's word, acting upon the Word of God first by asking – praying – to "receive true freedom." This means a freedom to speak, as St. Paul also says today, "Owe nothing to anyone." Do not worry about what others may think. Have the courage that comes from God to think of the salvation of the other as so important to speak about it, to lovingly correct a brother or sister in Christ if he/she has gone astray. It is not a moralistic gesture, a correction because "this is right" and "that is wrong". It is to love someone to the degree of forgetting about being nice in this world for the sake of being nice and not causing conflict. The greatest love is to give one's life, to cut with human affections and allow divine grace to take over, because the salvation of a soul for eternity in heaven is the greatest love that can be offered. That's what Jesus did for all of us, for the entire world, for every human soul ever created when he died on the cross and then rose from the dead. Love conquers and love liberates. Love is speaking freely so that a soul may not be lost but be saved. Grateful for the gift of our own salvation through baptism and the ongoing salvation received through the sacraments, we allow Jesus to live within us and continue his work of saving the world through us. We are his instrument if we always ask for that freedom to speak, without fear of rejection or what others may think of us. It goes back to Ezekiel, repeating the words from God: "But if you warn the wicked, trying to turn him from his way, and he refuses to turn from his way, he shall die for his guilt, but you shall save yourself."

Is their still hope for the salvation of the stubborn sinner? Let's listen to Jesus, as he concludes today's Gospel: "Again, amen I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." If that prayer is for the salvation of that stubborn sinner, Jesus is their listening. It's a great prayer and one that seeks salvation for another, eternity in heaven and not the opposite, isn't that love, isn't that a great prayer because it is thinking about another and not about oneself?



What was daily life like on the prairie of



southwestern Minnesota in the 1880s for Native American girls brought from Dakota Territory to a school in Avoca, Minnesota? What compelled Catholic sisters from a religious order in Pennsylvania to move to Avoca to serve at the school? The public is invited to hear the results of research into the school during a one-day event on October 7 (10am-5pm) at St. Ann Catholic Church in Slayton, MN. This Fall Social Concerns Day, hosted by the Diocese of Winona-Rochester Social Concerns Committee, will feature local historians, representatives from the religious order the sisters belonged to, displays of historical photos and documents, and performances of traditional Native American dance and music. The public is invited but space is limited and advance registration is required. The registration fee is \$20 and includes Native American food for lunch.
