Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We began "Ordinary Time" in the liturgical calendar this past Tuesday, with today being the "Second Sunday in Ordinary Time". The readings today focus on call and response. God initiates the call to the young Samuel. Jesus initiates the invitation to "Come ... and see". As followers of the Lord Jesus, we have been initiated in the faith at baptism through the response given by our parents and godparents, as most of us received the sacrament as infants, unable to respond for ourselves. Today, the Church continues to develop the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA). In the first centuries of the Church, adult formation was done through what was called the catechumenate. One of the works of the Second Vatican Council was to bring back the catechumenate, thus bringing forth the RCIA and now the OCIA.

Pope Paul VI said these words back in 1977: "...baptism, the sacrament of Christian regeneration, ... must return to being what it was in the conscience and custom of the first generations of Christianity. The practice and norms of the Church have introduced the holy habit of conferring baptism on newborns, leaving the baptismal rite to liturgically concentrate the preparation which, in the early times, when society was profoundly pagan, preceded baptism, and which was called catechumenate. But in today's social environment this method needs to be integrated by education, by an initiation into the Christian lifestyle, after baptism, that is, by religious assistance, by practical training in Christian fidelity, by an effective insertion into the community of believers, which is the Church. Here is the rebirth of the name "catechumenate", which certainly does not want to invalidate or diminish the importance of the baptismal discipline in force but wants to apply it with a gradual and intensive method of evangelization, which recalls and renews in a certain way the catechumenate of other times. Those who have been baptized need to understand, to rethink, to appreciate, to indulge in the inestimable fortune of the sacrament received."

Our baptismal call certainly needs to be reawakened. Let us be open, like Samuel and the Apostles, to follow Jesus more closely through the opportunities the Church continues to offer us after baptism.

In the Gospel today, Jesus asks "What are you looking for?"

Often, we are looking for happiness I very selfish ways, but we find that when we look for ways to make others happy, it is then that we truly become happy.

In the months of October, November and December, through your gifts, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was able to bring happiness to others by assisting 136 adults and 106 children. 



Free Coach Bus Ride to State Capital on January 22

Please join the rally to save the unborn. In 2023, Minnesota lawmakers passed legislation legalizing abortion-up-to-birth. They also repealed a newborn's right to lifesaving treatment. Even more anti-life measures are being considered for 2024. Now is the time to make clear to our elected officials that no child is forgotten, and that moms and babies deserve our protection.

As in the past, Owatonna Bus Company will provide a free coach bus to St. Paul. The bus will board at the Sacred Heart Church parking lot in Owatonna at 8:00 am on January 22 (leaving at 8:15). The bus will stop at the Speedway Travel Plaza in Faribault at 8:40.

At 10:00, we will be dropped off at the Cathedral of St. Paul for a prayer service. Then, we will walk to the capital for the March for Life which begins at noon. The bus will depart the capital at 1:30, returning to Owatonna at about 2:45 pm.
